

Selection Evaluation

This scholarship is offered by Ziplines New Zealand Limited, who do business as EcoZip Adventures. Scholarship applications are considered on a range of criteria including:

- Academic merit, extracurricular involvement, leadership capability, experience within the hospitality and/or tourism industry & overall quality of submission.
- The EcoZip Adventures Adventure Tourism Scholarship is an ambassadorial role and the selection panel focus on strong communication skills, positive and engaging personalities, a diligent approach to study and work and applicants demonstrating committed interest in tourism or hospitality.
- Evidence of reliability, grooming and time management demonstrated via character references.
- Service to the community is a highly considered attribute.

Conditions of Scholarship

- The Scholarship Selection Panel's decision is final, and no further correspondence will be entered into.
- The Scholarship is for the Adventure Tourism Management Diploma programme commencing in April 2024 and is non-transferable.
- To be considered for the Scholarship, applicants must meet all entry requirements of the QRC Diploma they are applying for and will be 18 years of age at programme commencement.
- The Scholarships value will cover the QRC Adventure Tourism Management Diploma tuition fees less the Government Fees Free grant. The Scholarship does not include the costs associated with re-sitting any failed papers or cost of living, such as accommodation. Tuition fees are subject to annual increases.
- Scholarship recipients will accept an ambassadorial role for QRC and EcoZip
 Adventures and willingly participate in future marketing activities as requested by
 EcoZip Adventures and, or, QRC's Marketing Department, including signing a photo
 and video model release form.
- Scholarship funds are directly paid to the QRC Admissions team and credited to fees.
- Successful recipients of the Scholarship must sign and accept the contractual
 agreements and obligations of the Scholarship. Any withdrawal from the programme
 prior to completion will require the student to re-pay the Scholarship fees invested
 by EcoZip Adventures. Dismissal from the programme due to a recipient's noncompliance with QRC policies or, poor academic performance will result in a financial
 obligation by the recipient for all scholarship funds accepted.

Expectations of Scholarship Recipient

- Be a responsible member of the QRC community and abide by the regulations of QRC.
- Be an Ambassador for EcoZip Adventures and QRC and be actively involved in any promotions, Student Council, EQRC and other areas identified by QRC.
- Fulfil the programme requirements (attendance, personal excellence, assignments and examinations) and progress through the diploma programme within the 21-month time frame.





- Be a leader on campus and report any difficulties in complying with the Scholarship or the Diploma to the Student Services Manager.
- Undertake a 9-month (1000 hours) paid internship programme at EcoZip Adventures's locations in Waiheke Island and Kaikōura.
